repair-overhaul (MRO) sector, such as the need to connect remote engineers to MRO IT systems.

Skypaq also offers a full electronic flight bag (EFB) platform in conjunction with technology partners such as European Aeronautical Group (EAG).

The application is platform independent and can run on Class 1, 2 and 3 EFB hardware.

The company's technology is classified by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the Joint Aviation Authorities (JAA). ■
